1	-	Paragraph 10	The requirement to address international leakage introduces a set of technical and political challenges for methodologies which produce project-level baselines that are derived from a jurisdictional reference emissions level (REL). This includes, e.g., JREDD and the current wave of project REDD+ methodologies (VM0048, M002). In a given period of time, one Party's leakage emissions from deforestation could also be counted towards a neighboring Party's REL. A future PACM REDD+ methodology should include coherent carbon accounting to address this issue.	To avoid being overly prescriptive, we recommend that the standard provide general guidance for methodologies: "To avoid double counting of emissions, activity methodologies which derive project/program baselines from jurisdictional reference emission levels shall specify the relationship between international leakage and the calculation of reference emission levels."
